- ***One library card will be issued to each student, through which she can borrow a book for 14 days.***
- ***All books should be returned by the due date marked on the card. In the event of a late return of the book, a fine of Rs. 1 will be levied per day.***
- ***In case the card is lost, it should be informed to the librarian immediately in writing.***
- ***Reference books and magazines will have to be used in the library only.***
- ***The deposit for membership in the library is INR 100 for a year.***
- ***Overnight lending book issues will be on the I-cards of students only. This is only for one night.***
- ***Strict silence should be observed inside the library.***
- ***Cell phones and other electronic gadgets are not allowed inside the library.***

PROHIBITION OF RAGGING

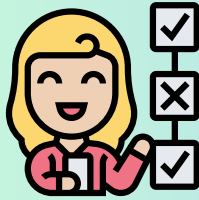
The Gujarat Government has passed the Gujarat Prohibition of Ragging Act, 2016. As per Act, Ragging within or outside the Education Institute is Prohibited.

The punishment for ragging shall range from suspension from attending classes and academic privileges to expulsion, as well as dismissal to an extent that a student cannot be admitted in any educational institution for a period of five years.

The decision of the Principal will be final in all matters of discipline and enforcement of rules. Depending on the nature of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the College, the punishment or suspension will be issued.

GIRLS HOSTEL RULES

1. For hostel admission, the following documents are required:

- **Recent Passport Size Photo**
- **Copy OF Mark Sheet attested by certified authority**
- **Copy of the Leaving Certificate**
- **Fee Receipt for the Current Year of College**

2. Each student needs to submit references of relatives residing in Ahmedabad with identity proofs from their parents. (Along with parents' ID, submit the ID of relatives.)

3. It is compulsory for students to attend Prathna Sabha.

4. Each student should reside according to the room, bed, and floor allotted to her.

5. Parents and relatives can meet students in the meeting room only on Sunday. No one is allowed to meet students in their hostel rooms. Without prior approval, parents can't take students outside the campus.

6. After entering the hostel room, students can't leave the hostel without the prior approval of an authorized officer.

7. The students going out of the city need to inform the hostel warden in writing. With the permission of the hostel warden, they can leave the campus.

8. The students will clean and manage their rooms on their own. Nobody will spit anywhere on the campus. Nobody will write anything on the property of the institution.

9. The garbage must be disposed of in the dustbin. If found guilty, he will be punished with a fine of 500 rupees.

10. The students can't take any items (dish, spoon, bowl, glass) from the dining hall to anywhere. If you do so, you will be punished with a fine of 50 Rs. Which will be transferred into the Entertainment Fund.

11. If the student has any disease by birth or hereditary, they need to inform prior admission. In such a case, the decision of management for admission will be final.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

NATIONAL CADET CORPS

NCC has an essential role in instilling in the youth the values of character, patriotism, solidarity, and selflessness. It helps to shape young people into disciplined, responsible, confident, and patriotic citizens of their country. The N.C.C. organization provides a platform for self-development and helps to redirect the enthusiasm of young people toward nation-building. The N.C.C. unit receives internal training in the form of drills (with and without arms), weapon training (0.303 dp Rifle, SLR, LMG), external training in the form of participation in sports/games, camps such as Annual Training Camp, Sthal Sainik Camp, Army Attachment Camp, National Integration Camp, Republic Day Camp, and adventure camps such as hiking, trekking, rope climbing, river crossing, rock climbing, horse riding, etc. Several of our cadets have joined the Army, Navy, and Air Force.

At our campus we have one unit of NCC with 50 students. They organize weekly parade and participate in state and national level camp activities.



NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

INITIATIVES

1. Student Support Programme (Since 2010)

With the objective of assisting slow learners in achieving academic goals, the Student Support Program was started. 5. Psychological Counselling (Since 2013)

This program was initiated with the purpose of creating awareness regarding mental health and overcoming the emotional disorder in them. The psychologist is regularly available every Friday for counselling. Initially, few students approached, but gradually this practice gained momentum, and many students opened up about their problems. If required, the parents were called and counselled accordingly. The whole process had been kept confidential to keep privacy intact.

The emotional and mental disorders were addressed properly through counselling. Many students seek counselling for their family-related and social problems. Their fear, anxiety, and lack of confidence gradually dwindled. This practice has improved their confidence and way of looking at life.



6. Know Your Students(Since 2014)

The idea was to understand students from physical, social, mental, and emotional perspectives. For the creation of a conducive environment for teaching and learning, open communication and the sharing of thoughts are necessary. Know Your Student helps gather information like hobbies, family background, dislikes, and nature of students. The faculties can use this information to make learning more engaging and understand their problems.

The open interaction helps in identifying the personal skills and characteristics of students. This can be utilized for identifying the strengths and weaknesses of the student on a personal level.

10. Habit of Nutritious Intake(Paushtik Aahar) (Since 2016)

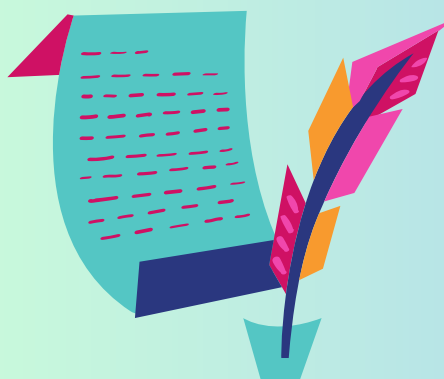

It has been observed that students now a days prefer junk food and street food over homemade breakfast. Due to western culture's impact, food habits have drastically changed. 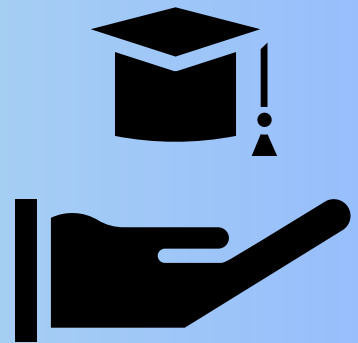
As students can have direct interaction with the author, it has motivated them towards reading. The students took interest in literature and the biographies of the authors.

Many students showed enthusiasm and took active participation in it. The different stalls were arranged for food items, art work, handicrafts, purses, and ethnic wear.

Through this platform, students learned business skills and the current trends of the market. They will be aware with recent shifts in consumers' likes, dislikes and buying pattern. It helped them to become successful entrepreneurs in the future.

13. RRR (Recognize, Resist, Report)

Being Girls College, We strictly adhere to student security and safety. The RRR (Recognize, Resist, and Report) was introduced to create awareness about rights and powers available to women against mental and sexual harassment. The students are informed about harassment at home, work place, in transition or at any other place. They were guided to raise voice and report for any type of violence and harassment. If need arise counselling facility is provided.
